In 2017 we had over 250 children registered for mentoring programs. Despite a funding decrease from one of our core funders, we still provided service to 167 local youth. There are over 80 youth waiting for the opportunity to have a mentor. All of us can make a positive difference in the lives of the children and youth in our communities in as little as an hour per week!

Thank you to everyone who continues to be connected with BBBSHPEC by volunteering or financial support, and to those considering to become part of our success story. Big Brothers Big Sisters Mentoring is a community based mentoring program where volunteers are matched one to one with a young person taking part in a variety of different activities.

In School Mentoring matches a volunteer with a child in need of a mentor in a local elementary school where time spent together can be as simple as reading a book, playing a board game, doing a craft, or being active on the playground.

Fundraising Financial Analysis:

2017 was a refreshing year thanks in great part to the success we realized at Ribfest. Last year we raised more than we have in the past 10 years of Ribfest operations at Big Brothers and Big Sisters. The following is a recap of our profits for the last 10 years after the start up of this event.

Ribfest profits were outstanding due to the excellent weather and the excitement of hosting Ribfest at a new venue – Quinte West. Clearly Ribfest is our most profitable fundraiser and it definitely helps to contribute to the agency's solvency.

Again Bingo, Trivia and Nevada events don't generate huge growth but they do provide a steady stream of revenue and all of these events offer much needed cash flow to the agency. Our JT Golf Tournament also offered a nice windfall of cash in the amount of approx. 3400.

Agency Operational Results:

The agency closed the year with a net deficit of 13,708. The Company's debt is limited to account payable and accrued liabilities totalling 14,430. However our cash position resulted in a positive flow of 5,340, and our Veterans' Restricted Fund remained intact at 27,827. Our agency was further aided in solvency thanks to our line of credit of 20,000.
